Here are some great gift ideas for you or your friends and family. These gadgets range from expensive to reasonable, from simple to cutting edge, and from practical to just plain fun. After reading, you may want to get something for yourself or maybe even something for your favorite ÜberGeek.

With the NHJ Wristwatch Television, you don't have to choose between missing the NFL half-time show and running to the store for more nachos. Do both! The 1.5" Active Matrix TFT color monitor has a 280 x 220 resolution. View channels 1-12 (VHF) or 13-62 (UHF) and listen to monaural sound with the antenna/earphones. The built-in rechargeable lithium-polymer battery and optional 4 AAA alkaline batteries provide up to 3 hours of viewing. Charge time is 1.5 hours.

Laks' Memory Music Watch lets you bring your music with you. The watch has a microphone for voice recording, an MP3 player, and between 32 to 512 MB of Flash Memory, depending on the model. The watch ships with ear bud headphones and an integrated USB cable. A built-in USB powered lithium battery recharges in 1.5 hours and provides up to 5 hours of play.

The Planisphere Watch has a mini planisphere on the dial. It shows which constellations are visible in the Northern Hemisphere between 35 and 50 degrees latitude. The watch has a rubber and steel band and a luminescent dial that glows for up to 3 hours.

The Galilea Moon Phase Clock shows the time as well as the current lunar phase. The nine inch clock displays the daily evolution of the moon phases through its 29.5 day cycle. It runs on one AA battery.

The Meade 14" LX200GPS-SMT has a universe of features. It boasts 711x magnification, a 145,000-object onboard celestial software library, a 16-channel GPS, a built-in electronic compass that aligns the scope due north, and sensors that level the scope parallel to the ground.

Autostar software integrates the telescope and your computer. Clicking one of the 19,000,000 stars, nebulas, galaxies, star clusters, planets, asteroids, comets, Earth satellites, or deep space objects in the on-screen sky map causes the telescope to automatically locate that object.

The Lunar/Planetary Imager automatically takes multiple exposures and selects the best images. It aligns multiple images and combines them into one improved image. It also works as an autoguider for long exposure deep space photography with a 35mm camera.
